



REDUCING MOLE DAMAGE

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Moles are beneficial animals that eat insects and grubs. However, their tunneling can create unsightly ridges and cause damage to your lawn. Controlling moles humanely and effectively can greatly improve the appearance and playability of your lawn.



What Causes Mole Damage?

Moles live in underground tunnels and push soil to the surface, creating ridges and volcano-like mounds. These tunnels can interfere with mowing, water flow, and the overall health of your lawn.



Signs of Mole Activity

- Raised ridges across the lawn (tunnels)
- Volcano-shaped mounds of soil
- Soft or spongy areas in the turf
- Mole activity is often seen in spring and fall.



Our Approach

We use a multi-step approach to reduce mole activity and repair damage. Our goal is to make your lawn less attractive to moles while improving turf health and appearance.

1 Assess & Identify Activity



We inspect your lawn to identify active tunnels and mounds, determining the best areas to focus on.

2 Disrupt Tunnels



Active tunnels are collapsed to disrupt their system and encourage them to leave.

3 Apply Mole Repellent



We apply a professional mole repellent to make the soil environment unappealing to moles.

4 Improve Turf Conditions



Healthy, thick turf is less likely to be damaged. We provide the nutrients and care your lawn needs.



Helpful Tips

- Water deeply to keep soil firm—moles prefer loose, moist soil.
- Keep your lawn thick and healthy to make it less attractive.
- Remove grubs! Moles eat grubs, so controlling them reduces the food source that attracts moles.
- Patience is key. It may take time for moles to move on.
